This report summarizes the average results of the impact evaluation, supported by the University of Mannheim, Chair of Corporate Social Responsibility.

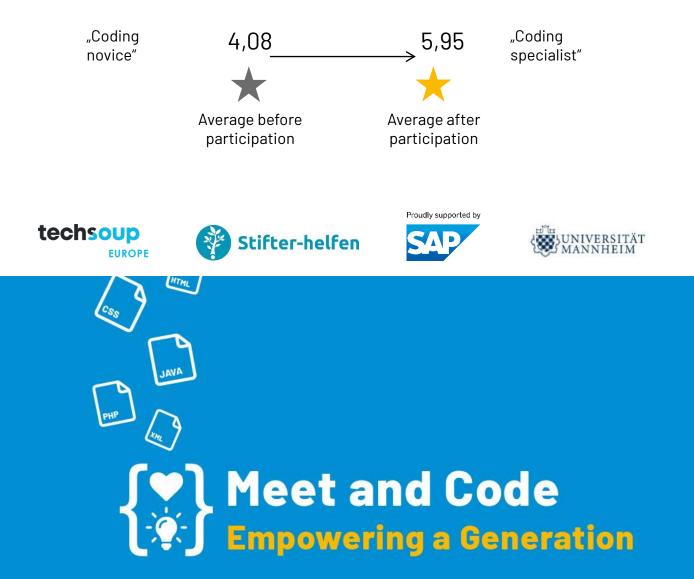

Impact Report: IT SKILLS

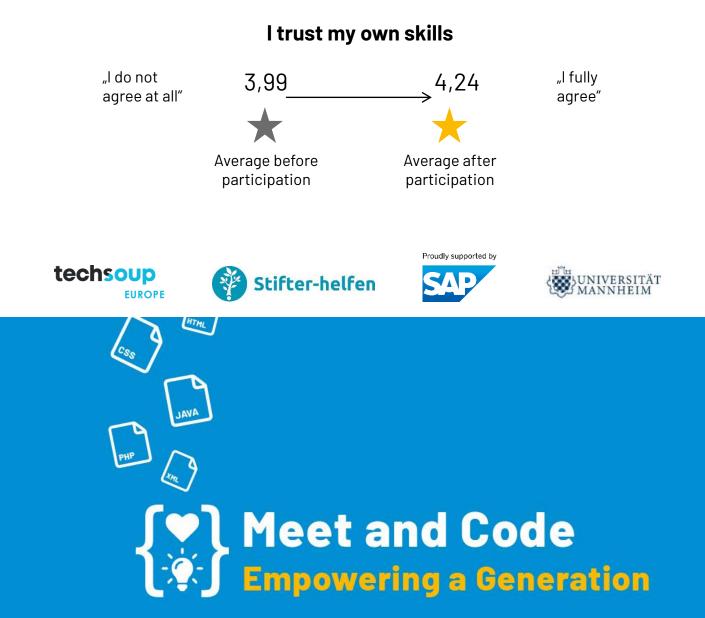
One key goal of Meet and Code is to increase participants' IT skills. We measured perceptions of IT skills before and after the events on a scale from 1 to 10. The data indicates an increase in participants' perception of their IT skills.





Impact Report: INDIVIDUAL SKILL TRUST

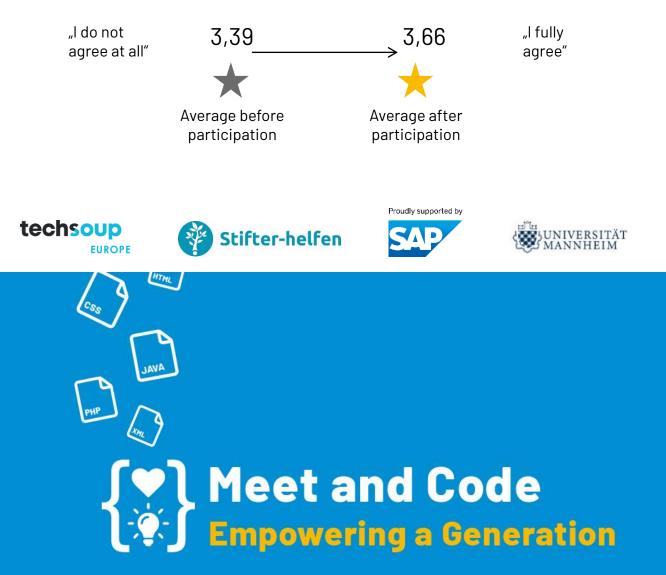
A second central goal of Meet and Code is to strengthen participants' overall trust in their own skills. Participants were asked about their perception on a scale from 1(I do not agree at all) to 5(I fully agree). The event also showed to be effective on this dimension.





Impact Report: JOB ASPIRATION

Finally, a key question is whether participation in the events actually inspires the participants to strive for jobs in the IT sector on a scale from 1(I do not agree at all) to 5(I fully agree). As indicated by the results below, the before and after evaluation reveals an increase on this dimension, and thus, a positive impact.
